# **Tobacco Valley Teachers Federal Credit Union CEO to Retire**

Myrijam began her career with TVTFCU in 1989 as the Assistant Manager when the credit union was located on Hazard Avenue in Enfield. In 2004 she was promoted to the position of Manager and CEO at the current location on South Road. During that time period she oversaw the incremental move from Hazard Avenue that took place in 1996. The decision was made to purchase the Enfield Dairy Bar and renovate it so members could enjoy a larger, improved credit union that offered additional services and products. Under Myrijam's leadership, TVTFCU has grown to serve almost 3,900 members and approximately \$42,650,000 in assets.
